COMMISSIONER, CITY MANAGER, DEPARTMENT REPORT

Mayor Padilla reported that he attended the San Juan County event and expressed his appreciation to the staff for their effor s on the booth. He also shared a proposed timeline for hiring a new City Manager and City Attorney. He plans to review applications on September 2–3, present the selected candidates to the commission on September 9, and finalitie the attorney's contract by the October 28 meeting. Current City Manager Jeff Blackburn is scheduled to retire on November 14.

Mayor Pro-Tem also attended the fair and expressed satisfaction with the work done on the booth. He shared that he had a conversation with a cirizen about the skatepark and noted that the Flora Vista Ditch is now entering into a diought restriction. City Manager mentioned the city has a meeting scheduled for Wednesday at 1:00pm to discuss wate conditions.

Commissioners Crowley and King expressed their gratitude to the staff for their hard work and dedication to organizing recent events.

City Manager Jeff Blackburn informed the commission that the Parks Department will be removing the hanging flower baskets earlier than usual due to the drought. He also presented the Gross Receipts Tax (GRT) report for June and notified the commission of an upcoming COG meeting scheduled for October. Additionally, he announced that he will be on vacation from August 29 to September 6 and will place someone as acting manager.

Electric Director John Wheeler presented a brief video demonstraling how the Electric Department would conduct a rescue of an injured worker from a power line.

Community Development Director Andrew informed the commission about ongoing cleanup—fforts on Zia Street including the news article and highlighted the continued increase in development th oughout the city.

Project Manager Jeric Jaramillo updated the commission on the arterial project, reporting that paving has begun. He also noted the need for a change order, as the pavement must be thicker than originally planned.
